Each instructor will sign on the card the tests passed by him. The boy will give his card to Activities Director each Friday before Swim Period, 11:00 A. M., in order that records may be made of the Scout's progress for that week and awards made accordingly.

The total points of all the Scouts in any tent or house may be added together and then divided by the number of Scouts in the tent for daily average. (Totem Pole.)

Fourth Year (400 points required) must include numbers 3, 4, 6, 13, 14, 15, 18, 20, 28. Balance of required points can be made up from any of the remaining numbers. Only one year's course be passed each season.
